

This Indenture made the twenty first day of Sep^r in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and forty three between Philip Long of Orange County of the one part and Henry Heartland of the County of Orange of the other part Witnesseth that the said Philip Long for and in consideration of the sum of five shillings paid to him in hand paid by the said Henry Heartland the rec^d whereof is hereby acknowledged hath granted bargained sold and by those presents doth grant bargain and sell unto the said Henry Heartland all that tract or parcels of land situated lying and being in Orange County containing by estimation two hundred and five acres of land be the same more or less beginning at a Corked Ash on Charonels River side and running thence twenty two Degrees west 140 poles thence South 14 Degrees west one hundred & thirty poles thence South 60 Degrees west 110 and poles to the River thence west
